The Council of University Executives (formerly the Quality Network for Universities) provides an opportunity for senior leaders to network with peers and exchange ideas about the strategic leadership of the university, research and innovation, and international partnership development.



A unique forum for member universities, the Council of University executives meets twice a year – once in Canada at a member institution and a second time internationally as part of an experiential study tour to explore and discuss the implications of national and international trends with university and business leaders, entrepreneurs, policy-makers, and leading thinkers.

Through the Council, members can:

- network informally and engage in candid discussion about common challenges with peers;
- identify new partnerships, both within Canada and abroad, as well as new strategies around topics critical to the university mission, drawing on research and best practices from across sectors;
- discuss and debate the implications of national and international trends, meeting with policy-makers and leading thinkers shaping the public policy framework influencing universities' choices;
- access the expertise of The Conference Board of Canada in support of internal initiatives.

Who should join

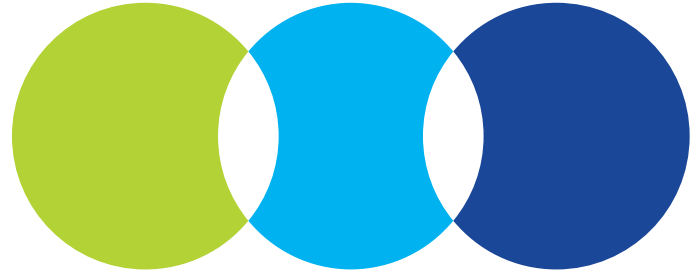

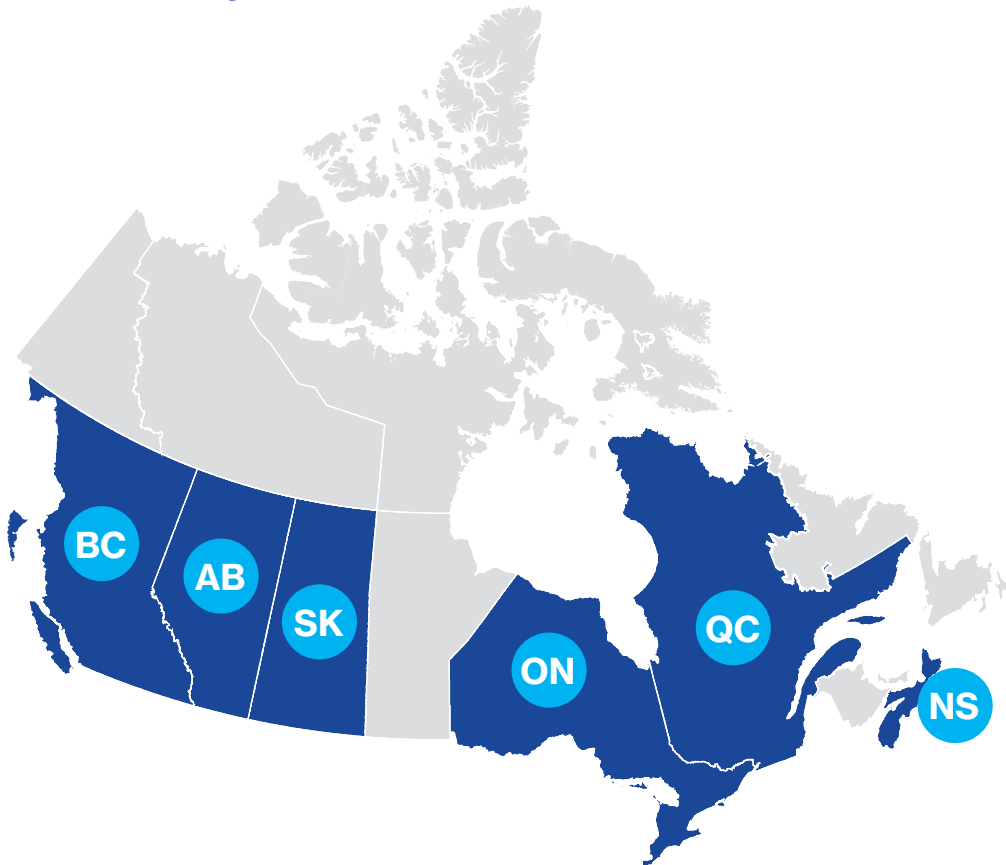

COVID-19: The short- and long-term implications for universities

Infrastructure: How can universities think creatively about using or reinventing campus infrastructure? How will universities decide what changes are permanent?

Online learning: How have universities handled the shift to online learning? What decisions have universities made in terms of cost, technology, accessibility, and professor supports to facilitate online and remote learning?

Graduate education: How has the virtual environment impacted teaching and learning for graduate students? How can universities increase cross-disciplinary and cross-cultural pollination for graduate students in online settings?

Faculty: How can universities facilitate a sustainable culture of faculty care? Have women and people of colour in academics been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic?

Internationalization: How do universities provide a holistic, immersive experience for international students during and after COVID-19? How can international students and the internationalization of university campuses strengthen Canada's diversity?

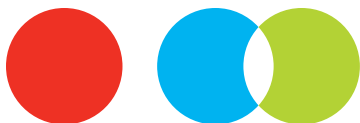
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
